me·mo·ri·al (m...-môr"l-...l, -m½r"-) n. Abbr. mem. 1. Something, such as a monument or holiday, intended to celebrate or honor the memory of a person or an event. 2. A written statement of facts or a petition presented to a legislative body or an executive. --me·mo·ri·al adj. 1. Serving as a remembrance of a person or an event; commemorative. 2. Of, relating to, or being in memory. [Middle English, from Old French, from Late Latin memori³le, from neuter of Latin memori³lis, belonging to memory, from memoria, memory. See MEMORY.] -- me·mo"ri·al·ly adv.

MEMORIAL - Old Testament - Strongs Exhaustive 2143 "Memory, Commemorative, remembrance, record, reminder. New Testament - Strongs Exhaustive 3422 "Be mindful, make mention, remember".

It is our remembrance of those with whom we shared some part of their lives. It is not a time of sadness, but a remembrance and commemorative of the good time we shared together. FLAG ETIQUETTE

Many square dance events include playing the national anthem with or without the pledge to the flag. We have often wondered about the proper way to show respect for the flag during these times. While in the Navy and in uniform, there was never any doubt. Now that I am a civilian I am not so sure.

This month we would explore this important subject. We read the following in a recent issue of Shift Colors, the newsletter sent to Navy retirees. We hope it will help you as much as it did us.

Our nation's flag is to be respected, never defaced or scorned. There are appropriate ways to show respect in the presence of the Flag.

During the ceremony of hoisting or lowering the flag or when the flag is passing in a parade or in a review, everyone should face and stand at attention with their right hand over their heart. Military members who are present and in uniform should render the military salute.

When not in uniform, remove your hat (if wearing one) with your right hand and hold it at the left shoulder, the hand being over the heart. Citizens of other countries should stand at attention. The salute to the flag in a moving column (such as a parade) should be rendered at the moment the flag passes. If walking, stop, turn toward the flag and stand at attention with your right hand over your heart.

When the flag is displayed during the playing of the national anthem, all present, except those in uniform, should stand at attention facing the flag with right hand placed over the heart. If not in uniform, remove your hat (if wearing one) with your right hand and hold it at the left shoulder. the hand being over the heart. Persons in uniform stand and render the military salute. The salute begins at the first note of the anthem and should be held until the last note is played. When the flag is not displayed, those present should face the music and act in the same manner they would if the flag were displayed there.

We are interested in your thoughts about this custom, let us know what you think. We also hope this information has helped you as much as it has us. That's all for this month. Keep smiling' and we will see ya in a square!

LINE DANCING AT THE BARN

Here's the top 10 list I promised you. Happy Valentines Day to all of you devoted Line Dancers, who gather at THE BARN with Joe and Maggie O'Connell on Wednesday Mornings from 10 to 11:30, and to all who gather on Thursday with Glenda Ortiz.

Alabama takes the #1 place. It starts with a heel down right, left, right, left then 4 polkas forward. Last step is a 6 count weavy vine - step right, left behind, turn right to back of hall, step left, right behind and step left. End of dance.

Calcutta (very popular up north) is # 2. It's a series of polkas. Cross right over left, step left, cross right over left, touch left. Cross left over right, step right, cross

left over right, touch right. Polka right to back of hall, polka left to side, polka back, polka forward, polka right 1/2 turn to front of hall, polka left, polka back, polka front or forward. 8 count Charleston finishes dance: touch right forward, step right in place, touch left, in place, repeat. # 3 is Hully Gully - a popular short dance! Basic left with kick & clap, repeat on right, repeat on left, march right, left, right, hop right, hop left, 1/4 turn right hop. Jamboree takes # 4. 8 count Charleston, 2 polkas forward, right, left, 1/4 turn left, rock right left right left; 2 polkas back, 1/4 turn right, rock right left right left; 2 count right vine - right step, behind left, rock right, recover left, step right; repeat 2 count left vine with rock, recover, step. End of dance.

5 goes to Jesse Polka, a round dance! Left heel down, right toe down, right heel down, left heel hook, 4 polkas left right left, right, basic left with kick, repeat on right, left kick, right kick, walk forward left right left right. Repeat dance. Coming up # 6 - Let the Cowboy Dance! Two 2 steps forward, left, right, a box to left forward, box to right back, two 2 steps back, box forward, box back, 2 step to left, cross right over left, cross left over right, 2 step to right, circle left with four 2 steps! That's it! # 7 - Let's make that Rhumba Maria!Left box forward, right box back, rock back left, recover right forward, basic turn right to back of hall, left step, drag with right, march left right left, right step drag with left, march right left right, cross left over right, cross right over left, repeat cross overs, and begin dance.

8 - The Robert E. Lee (this line dance won first place in the Line Dance Olympics in New Hampshire awhile back). Basic right with double heel slap with right hand, back left with double heel slap with left hand, walk 2 forward right & left, step forward right with 1/2 turn to back of hall, left right left right heel down, right toe down; left heel down, toe down, polka right, polka left, quick 1/2 turn to back of hall, polka right, polka left. End of dance.

9 slot goes to Linny Bubbles (2 wall dance). Left heel down, right heel down, left heel rock left right left, left turn with right foot - count 1 2 3 kick left, walk right to count of 4! San Antonio Stroll tops off the list! It can get you in the mood at the beginning of a session, or cool you down at the end! # 10 starts with a right B forward with a kick, left B back, repeat right & left, basic right, step touch, st tou, basic left, st tou, st tou! You've got your 10!

Our sincere thanks to Joe and Maggie! Keep practicing every day loyal dancers, so you can enjoy some candy hearts too!

Glenda Ortiz reports that her line dancing class on Thursday morning's at THE BARN is off to a good start for the new year with lots of great new dances for lots of fun. Oh yes, she has a new boy friend, too. So, candy hearts and flowers for Valentine's Day! Glenda says she would like to build up her class in number, so please bring your friends!

On November 13th, 1996 plans were submitted for the extension to THE BARN. On January 16th, 1997 Linda and I drove to Viera to pick up permit # 57810. Below is the cost associated with obtaining the building permit.




Terror means to instill intense fear. I would say that it is with good reason that we do not refer to abortionists as terrorist as they do much more than instill intense fear. They murder innocent children!

BUILDING AT THE BARN

There have been some changes at THE BARN! The stage area is much improved both functionally and aesthetically. NATURAL ALTERNATIVES TO OVER THE COUNTER AND PRESCRIPTION DRUGS

HERBS FOR TREATING CANCER

If you get cancer, there are some herbs that can be used to reduce the effects of chemotherapy and radiation.

Keith Block, M.D., medical director of the Cancer Care Program at Edgewater Medical Center in Chicago, is researching how herbs can be used in conjunction with standard cancer treatments. He has found that cancer patients undergoing standard treatment have fewer side effects, such as hair loss and nausea, when they take herbs that benefit the immune system.

So far, Siberian ginseng has not been proven to have any direct effect on cancer cells, but it can increase general resistance and improve side effects resulting from chemotherapy and radiation. In Russia in 1964, a tincture of Siberian ginseng was given to 38 people with similar types of cancer of the mouth an hour before they went through 14 days of radiation therapy. They experienced numerous benefits, including better sleep, an improved appetite and even a renewed interest in life, as well as normalization of blood pressure, pulse and breathing rates. Also, the wounds that resulted from the cancer healed approximately one month before those of the people in a similar group not taking the herbs. The researchers concluded that Siberian ginseng can counter the harmful effects of radiation treatment and increase the rate of healing. Two years later, another Russian experiment showed that Siberian ginseng decreased the toxic effects of chemotherapy used to treat breast cancer.



Laboratory studies in China and thousands of years of experience have paved the way for various herbs to be used in combination with Western drug treatments in Chinese hospitals. The herbs given to people with cancer include astragalus, ligustrum and Siberlan ginseng.

In numerous studies on astragulus and ligustrum, these two herbs improved the immune response in most of the people with cancer who took one or the other or both. Researchers even concluded that astragulus contains "one or more extremely potent naturally occurring immune stimulants." At the M.D. Anderson Cancer Center in Houston, researchers have found that immune-cells taken from people with AIDS and cancer became more active in the test tube and that these people felt physically and emotionally strengthened after being treated with astragalus.

Medical doctors in Japan are also more open to using herbs than are their counterparts in North America. After the National Cancer Research Center in Tokyo discovered in the 1980s that shiitake mushrooms could be used to shrink cancerous tumors, Japanese hospitals began giving their patients a shiitake concentrate to increase their immune response. Japanese doctors also used an extract of a mushroom called polporus to improve the expected cancer survival rate by a few years.

One herb that has had a lively history is pau d'arco. This medicinal plant has been used since the time of the Incas and the Aztecs to treat various Immune related problems, including poisonous snakebites. In the 1960s, the Brazilian press published reports that included hundreds of testimonials that declared pau d'arco a cancer cure and people were soon ripping the bark off trees throughout the country, even climbing into the Botanical Gardens in Campinas to do so. These people were spurred on by the miraculous story of a young girl in Rio de Janeiro who was cured of cancer after an angel visited her and told her about the bark. A newspaper account also told of University of Sao Paulo botanist Walter Accorsi, Ph.D., who daily dispensed the bark for free to crowds that sometimes numbered 2,000 people! Unfortunately, the sensational stories made most scientists cringe, and the little research that was done at places like Sao Paulo Hospital of Clinics was short-lived.

Herbal medicine works best when practiced holistically - that is, with the intent to heal the entire body and get at the sources of the physical and emotional imbalance. Today's medicine treats the symptoms. For example, if you get a headache you take a drug to get rid of the headache. With holistic treatment, you treat the body so you no longer get headaches. Normally the holistic treatment is not "instant" and we choose the "quick fix". We need to treat the body as a whole to have complete health.
