

DEATH - The Final Frontier?

WELCOME NEW DANCERS

During the past couple of months there have been several new dancer graduations. It has always been a great thrill for us to see new dancers enter the square dance activity. We have also been very proud to have been a part of the process which brought new dancers from the first "introductory" session to graduation.

Learning to square dance these days is not quite the same as it was during the early years of the 1930's and 40's. In those days dancers did not need to go through lessons to learn to dance. There were a very limited number of moves and a person could generally learn enough to get by during just a few dance sessions.

Today there is more to learn. We now have the CALLERLAB program lists which provide a worldwide standard for the dance programs. Now we can learn to dance a particular program, i.e. Basic, Mainstream, or Plus, and know that if we visit another club (even in a different country) which dances that program we will be able to dance. This was not always true. In the 1950's and 60's there was an explosion of new moves. It would not be unusual to go to a dance and hear (and be expected to dance) as many as 4 or 5 moves you had never heard before. As you can Imagine, this often led to confusion, rough dancing, and eventual dropout.

The chaos of the 1950's & 60's called for a solution. The development, implementation, acceptance and use of one set of standard program lists provided this solution. Now dancers can attend a dance advertised at one of the CALLERLAB programs and know what to expect. The CALLERLAB programs, styling information, definitions, and timing information have provided stability and standardization to the square dance activity during the past 25 years.

There has been much written about the transition from class to club dancing. With the influx of new dancers we all need to do whatever is required to make them feel welcome and a part of the activity. Transition can be a rewarding experience for both the experienced and newer dancers if all of us approach it with good humor, patience, and tolerance. We were ALL new dancers at one time. It is up to each of us to welcome our new members into the activity.

The new dancers have some responsibilities also. First, visit other clubs and callers either as part of a banner raid or on your own. Also, know the program you are comfortable with. The CALLERLAB programs include Basic, Mainstream, Plus, Advanced, and Challenge. If you are unsure of which program another group dances, ask your caller or club officers. Let them know you would like to dance with other groups. The best way to increase your dancing experience is to dance with other groups and callers. The best way to increase your dancing pleasure is to become comfortable with the program you have chosen to dance.


The best way to become more comfortable with any dance program is through dance floor time. The best (only) way to get floor experience is to dance! Dancing with different callers and clubs is best. This will provide the advantage of hearing other callers and making new friends. Several callers/clubs offer "refresher" or "rusty hinge" type workshops after graduation.

These type programs are very helpful to new dancers. Generally, these sessions are less structured than a normal class session. They generally do offer an opportunity for new dancers to concentrate on moves with which they


are least comfortable. DO NOT HESITATE to ask your caller/instructor to show and practice a particular move.

In April of this year, I had the privilege of making a pilgrimage to Medjugorje, in Bosnia-Hercegovina. It is there, that the Blessed Mother of Jesus, appeared to six children on June 25, 1981. And is still appearing to four of them every day at a certain hour of the day. Several of the visionaries now have families of their own. Never having been outside of the United States and not liking to fly, I didn't really think I would ever go half way around the world and all by myself, even. But, I wanted to go to Medjugorje and everything for the trip to become possible just fell into place so easily.

I left a week before my trip to Medjugorie, to spend Easter with my children and grandchildren in Wisconsin. Kip, Terry and Jude drove me to Orlando and wished me a wonderful trip and pilgrimage half thinking I was losing my mind. The flight to Chicago was flawless and we landed at 9:30 a.m. No one was at the gate to meet me so I went down to collect my luggage and wait for my daughter and daughter-in-law to pick me up. They were driving from Appleton, Wisconsin to O'Hara International Airport, a two hour drive for them. They had told me they might not be there until 10:30am At 12:00pm I started to get concerned for their safety and called Kip in Florida, to have him call my son in Appleton, to see what time the girls had left. (I didn't have any phone numbers with me and wasn't carrying along anything I didn't want to have with me for my trip overseas). Ten minutes later I called Kip back to find out what he found out. The girls should have been at O'Hara at 9:30am. Oh bov. now I was nervous and worried, where were Angie and Judi? As I walked back to my suitcases a porter asked me if I'd like a hat and jacket, so I could start work, since I'd been sitting there so long. I told him my story and he suggested I page the girls so I went over to the orange phone hanging on the wall and had them paged. I sat back down to wait and then I realized I heard no pages, so if I didn't hear my page for them, what if they were paging me. By this time the kind porter was keeping pretty close and kept watch over my luggage as I flew back to the phone to see if anyone had paged me. Sure enough, they had. "Go up to K-7 your party is there". Those were the most beautiful words, I had been so worried for them. I ran back to get my baggage and lug them up to K-7, but the porter said "Oh no, why should you go way up there, call the gate and have them come down here". so I hurried back to the orange phone. It was busy, busy, busy. As I stood waiting I looked back at my luggage and the porter was pointing out the orange phone to someone else. After another busy signal I turned and saw the two most beautiful faces, my daughter and daughter-in-law. Where had they been? LOST!! They had zipped right past the sign on the interstate that said O'Hara Indiana. They were looking for a sign that said airport, they didn't want to go to O'Hara, Indiana. So they ended up in downtown Chicago, south side, where no one wants to go. While there, they even got out of the car to ask directions. And so, they headed back to the northside and me. They were safe that's all that matters

A week later Judi drove me back to Chicago, we turned at the sign that said O"Hara Indiana and I got to the airport in plenty of time. She wouldn't leave me until I met up with the group I would travel with. And then she waved goodbye.

I was alone with people I didn't know, yet we all had a common desire, we were pilgrims to Medjugorje. We had a 97 year old gentleman with us, two ladies who were sisters well into there 70's and the other 27 of us were of varying ages. I really didn't meet any of them until we were in Medjugorje. Our flight over left at 3:30pm. There weren't a lot of people on the plane, so I had a window seat and the seat next to me was empty, which made the trip very comfortable. At 1:30am I looked out the window and the sun was shining so bright, it was 7:30am and soon we were on the ground in Paris. From Paris to Zegbeb, Croatia, then to Split, Croatia and then a three hour bus ride along the Adriatic Sea. It was very cold and having come from Florida, I didn't have a very warm coat along. As we drove along the mountainside, the view and cliffs down to the sea were so magnificent The houses and countryside were like I'd never seen. Toward dark the rain, wind and sleet started. The road was wet and I would have thought probably could be slippery. We had ascended higher up the side of the mountain and looking down the water was far below us and we drove along on the road that was just inches from the edge. I could no longer look down without feeling uneasy. I thought I'd rather be in an airplane. At one point I grabbed hold of a pole next to me and quickly let go, wondering what good it would do me if we went over the edge. I made the mistake of looking up front at the driver and saw that his windshield was fogged over, yet along we sped. Now I knew why our group leader had us start praying the rosary, she had been this way before. Soon, we turned inland and after one border check were into Bosnia. We finally crawled into bed about 11.:00pm after a very nice supper. The next morning started early, for nine days Medjugorje was home. Every morning our group met for the prayer and then breakfast, which usually was baked bread and cheese, eggs, peanut butter, juice, milk and instant coffee. Then off we went, the village was a mile hike through the fields and over the rocks. The fields were full of grape vines, not yet budding out We walked to the village at least three times a day and it never really seemed to be very far. When we were walking on a road, it was like a treat to be on smooth ground. I climbed Podbrdo (Appartition Hill) everyday. This is were the children first saw the Lady. Mt Krizevac(Mountain of the Cross) I only climbed twice. The cross on Mt. Krizevac was erected in 1933 and is almost 9m. high and made of concrete. It is mind boggling to think of the village people carrying all that concrete up there over all those rocks. The cross had been erected to God, after a flood in the valley, in the hope that God would keep Medjugorje safe forever more.

Our group was privileged to be present at an apparition, on the fourth day we were there. We met three of the visionaries, Vicka, is my favorite, she always has a smile, with special heartiness and endless patience with all of us pilgrims. Life in Medjuogrie, has changed since I 981. In a way, I feel sorry for the village people, their standard of living is better for sure, but, life will never be the same. It will be forever busy, millions of people of all faiths, from all over the world, have visited. And have left spiritually renewed. For some healings have taken place, there have been physical healings and many spiritual healings. What is the message of Medjugorje? Peace. The world is being called to conversion. To pray, pray, pray. Through prayer comes PEACE. Gods Mother, wishes everyone to know and love Her Son. Jesus.

There is so much more to my pilgrimage, but maybe this is enough for now. We left Medjugorje at 2:30am so it was dark driving back to the airport and so we weren't even aware of cliffs on our way home, in fact I thought we went a different way back. But, no they said there is but one way and that is along the Adriatic Sea. We were in Paris by 2:00pm and then went on a bus tour. Some of us slept After being in Medjugorje, what is Paris? :>)

I love being home with my family, but, I will also always miss Medjugorje. It was so peaceful there. So how we would like everyday to be. Thanks for listening, Peace to all, Linda Werner. PS. I kept calling the 97 year old gentleman, Stanley. Then someone said his name isn't Stanley his name is Charles. Oh, I thought it was Stanley, wonder where I got that name from. Well when I got home and saw our Stanley, I knew why I called Charles, Stanley. They really do look a lot alike. So Stanley, you were in Mediugorie too.

Cook until thick - cool very slightly


Add 4 TBS Strawberry Jello




