Memorial Hall was dedicated at this dance. Many positive comments were made about this new hall. A great big thank you to all who worked so hard to get the hall completed in time for this dance.

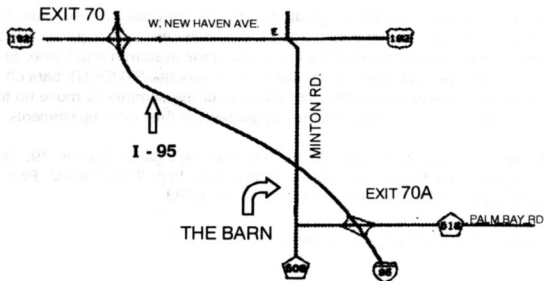

WORD STUDY OF THE WORD

GOD WAS, IS, and IS TO BE

"In the beginning was the Word and the Word was with God and the Word was God". (John 1:1)

"Thine, O Lord, is the greatness, and the power, and the victory, and the magistracy: for all that is in the heaven and the earth is Thine; Thine is the kingdom, O Lord, and Thou art exalted as Head above all" (1 Chron. 29:11)

"Worthy art Thou, O Lord, to receive the glory, and the honor and the power, because Thou - Thou didst creat all things, and because Thy will are they, and they were created". (Revelation 4:11)

In today's world we are perplexed. We are constantly bombarded with the terrible deeds of men. Is God present? Is God ruling the world? Look around. Do you see justice, safety, joy and peace?

As we turn to this Word and are instructed by it, we discover a fundamental principle which must be applied to every problem: Instead of beginning with man and his world and working back to God, we must begin with God and work down to man. "In the beginning God". Apply this principle to the present situation. Begin with the world as it is today and try to work back to God, and everything will seem to show that God has no connection with the world at all. But begin with God and work down to the world, and light, much light, is cast on the problem. Because God is holy His anger burns against sin; because God is righteous His judgments fall upon those who rebel against Him; because God is faithful the solemn threatening of His Word are fulfilled; because God is omnipotent none can successfully resist Him, still less overthrow His counsel; and because God is omniscient no problem can master Him and no difficulty baffle His wisdom. It is just because God is who He is and what He is that we are now beholding on earth what we do - the beginning of His outpoured judgments. In view of His inflexible justice and immaculate holiness we could not expect anything other than what is now spread before our eyes.

We cannot change God. We cannot blame God. We can take responsibility for our own actions and change the world. God wants the best for each of us. It is always easy and comfortable to try to place the blame elsewhere. It is never easy to accept and know that things are as they are because of me. A problem cannot be solved without knowing what the problem is. The problem is we don't take responsibility for our actions!

HOW CAN WE USE THE PROGRAMS?

(To increase Recruitment)

What are square dance programs? Why do we have programs? Both these questions have been asked many times. The answers are important to all square dancers. We would like to take a few moments to discuss this very important issue.

There are currently five primary programs used in square dancing; Basic, Mainstream, Plus, Advanced, and Challenge. Each of these programs contains all the moves in the previous program. That is, Mainstream also contains the moves in the Basic program, Plus contains the Mainstream/Basic moves, and Advanced includes Mainstream/Basic and Plus, etc. This means that the dancers who dance Plus are expected to know approximately 96 moves while dancers who dance Advanced are expected to know nearly 80 additional moves for a total of almost 180 moves.

In addition to these programs there is another program, called the Community Dance Program (CDP) which contains about twenty-five moves. This program is designed for dancers who do not have the time nor the

desire to dance more than once or twice every couple of months. In CDP clubs new non-experienced dancers can join the dancing on any night. The experience of the club dancers allows the new dancers to join the fun on the first night they visit the club.

The programs were developed by CALLERLAB, the International Association of Callers, and have been enjoyed by dancers over the past 20 years. The CALLERLAB programs define a world-wide standard to be taught and called in square dance classes and dances. Each of the program lists provide the set of moves that may be called at a dance advertised to be a specific dance program. Use of the existing program lists allow dance promoters to list the program which will be called at a particular open dance or event. This will allow dancers to select the dances which consist of the material with which they are familiar.

The CALLERLAB programs are not intended to segregate dancers into exclusive groups nor to indicate that any dancer who chooses to dance a specific program is any better, or any worse, than any other dancer. Dancing skill can be achieved at many programs, and the number of moves is not necessarily an indication of dancer proficiency. The ability of each dancer is based on how well the dancers know the moves in the program they dance, not how many moves they know.

The CALLERLAB programs provide a "home" for all dancers, regardless of the amount of time they wish to commit to the activity. The CDP is a subset of the Basic

program which provides a dance program for those who wish to dance very infrequently. Other programs provide a place for dancers who wish to dance more often. The most popular program world-wide is Mainstream. In the Central Florida area the most popular program is Plus.

There has been a proposal to combine some of the moves in the Mainstream program and some of the moves in the Plus program into one program. This will provide a program for those dancers who wish to participate more and learn more moves. This proposal is not intended to disrupt the current dancers or clubs but to increase our numbers.

There has been, for some time, much discussion about how we can increase the number of new dancers we bring into the activity. One way which has been discussed is to reduce the amount of time it takes for new dancers to learn to dance and join a club. The primary (perhaps only) way to do this is to reduce the amount of material to

be taught (learned). There is an existing program which, if utilized as it was designed, could accomplish this. That program is the Basic program to include the first 49 moves on the CALLERLAB program. This program can be taught in approximately 20 two hour sessions. By using this program, a club could run about three classes a year. Even if each class were only two squares, in a year the club would grow by six squares.

Another way to increase retention of new dancers is through the use of smooth flowing, comfortable choreography with just the right amount of challenge. The starting positions used by callers for the moves on any program are called "Applications". There exists, due to usage, a set of these Applications called "Standard Applications". These are the starting positions used most often by callers and, therefore, are heard most often by the dancers. Because of the fact that these positions are most familiar to the dancers, they are the ones the dancers will have the most success with. One way to decrease the learning time and increase the retention of new dancers is to provide more practice with these "Standard Applications" than with other, less familiar, applications.

GULP YOUR WAY TO HEALTH

WATER

One hydrotherapy treatment whose benefits are widely recognized by Doctors and patients alike know that drinking enough fresh, pure water is essential to our health and well-being.

This most basic form of hydrotherapy should be second nature to us--and it probably would be if we didn't keep coffee, cold beer and sugary cola on hand to quench our thirst. Though caffeinated and alcoholic beverages do contain water, both cause the body to excrete more water than it actually takes in. The result is a fluid deficit, which, over time, can lead to a variety of health problems, including dry skin, constipation and bladder infections.

These problems become more common in late adulthood, says Dr. Thrash, because our need for water actually increases with age. She recommends a minimum of 6 to 8 eight-ounce glasses of water a day for people under age 30, 8 to 10 eight-ounce glasses for those in their fifties and 10 to 12 eight-ounce glasses for active people 60 and over.

"As we age, our skin and mucous membranes become thinner and lose more water, and our kidneys function less efficiently, so our need for water increases," Dr Thrash says. "Older people just don't feel thirst the way we did when we were younger, so we need to get in the habit of drinking water even if we are not thirsty."

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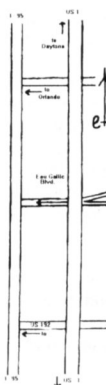

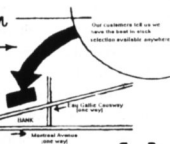

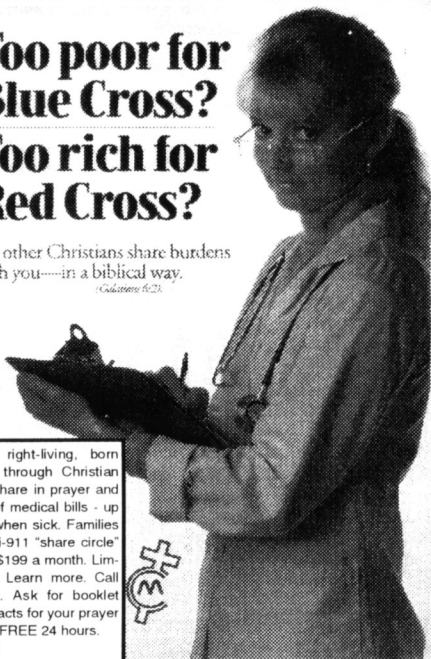
