FROM THE LOFT



This month I am going to give a report on the FINANCIAL status of THE BARN. I do not understand how some folks think THE BARN is a money making machine. Linda and I work at THE BARN every day of the week. We do all the cleaning and maintenance. We spend a minimum of 4 man hours a day on daily

cleaning. When the floors need to be waxed, we spend at least 8 man hours doing that chore. We do not get one thin dime for any of this. When we go out of town, Dale and Carolyn McClary do this task. There is no money available to hire someone for this task.

Now to the money side of our discussion. We are incorporated as a Not For Profit company, THE BARN DANCERS. We are required, by law, to file many documents with the State and Federal Government. We have a firm that does all this filing for us. We have used the same firm since THE BARN DANCERS was incorporated. To date (a period of three years) we have lost over \$33,000. This is money that Linda and I have taken from our savings to support THE BARN. We will be happy to make these returns available to anvone who doubts this article. We include THE BARN OWL in our costs. Each month Linda and Lspend 2 weeks putting out THE BARN OWL. This year, to date, we have spent \$1144.80 for its printing and \$205.67 for supplies to get the BARN OWL ready for printing. The total income, counting donations and ads. to date this year is \$1092.03. No, we don't have to print THE BARN OWL. No, we don't have to operate THE BARN. We love square dancing and the good it brings to the lives of those who dance here. I hope those who think we do it for the money will finally understand that there is no money to be made with a square dance hall. You may investigate the history of Square Dance Halls in the State of Florida to see that they do not stay in operation long. The ones that survive have turned to activities other than dancing to pay the bills. Colin Walton once owned his own hall. Ask him about the profits in square dancing.

We have undertaken two new projects that we hope will increase the entry of new folks into square dancing. A billboard ad campaign has been started. We asked all clubs in Brevard to join with us in this endeavor but all declined. Thus, Jerry and Del Reed and Otis and Linda Lutz are sponsoring this campaign. We hope it will help all clubs to increase their attendance. This is a year long campaign and cost us a total of \$1368.16 plus tax. We have also set up a web page that can be accessed by http://www.DanceWorld.org. This is another method we are using to attract new dancers into the wonderful world of square dancing.



A start-up business venture in Branson Missouri will soon begin regular television broadcasts of square dancing! Branson businessman Bill Simmons wanted to televise line and country western dancing. After learning about efforts to get square dancing on network TV.

he decided to add modern western square dancing to his show.

Branson is the Live Entertainment and the Family Vacation Capital of the World. Square dancing takes place right in the heart of town, at The Branson Opry House, 2805 Green Mountain Drive. The facility includes a restaurant, three hardwood dance floors, and enough television equipment to broadcast square dancing around the globe.

A daily one-hour show is all set to air on LVTN (Las Vegas Television Network) and on some of the UPN (United Paramount Network) affiliated stations, LVTN reaches about 3 million homes, and there are about 200 UPN affiliated stations. Both networks are rather small, but both have ambitious plans for future growth. Before anyone decides we don't want to be involved because we've never heard of these networks, keep in mind that most of network viewers have never heard of square dancing. As these networks grow, so will square dancing. It's a partnership.

Efforts continue to feature square dancing on larger networks, such as The Nashville Network (TNN). No one knows when or if square dancing will get on a large network. But starting this month, square dancing will be on LVTN everyday. As LVTN grows, square dancing grows too. It will also be easier to get square dancing on a large network after we're on our first network. Please note that network TV broadcasts from Branson will happen, with or without square dancing. The only question is do we want to step up and (Continued on page 20)

CRAWFISH PIE

2 lb. crawfish

1/2 cup cooking oil

1 cup chopped onions

1/2 cup chopped celery

1/2 cup chopped celery

1 Tbs. Crawfish fat

1 & 1/2 cups water

2 tablespoons cornstarch

1/2 cup chopped onion tops

1 Tbs. Parsley flakes

salt & red pepper to taste





Season crawfish tails with salt and pepper and set aside. Saute onions and celery in oil over medium heat until onions are wilted. Add crawfish and crawfish fat; let cook 20 minutes. Add cornstarch dissolved in 1 & 1/2 cups of water. Cook until thick, stirring constantly. Add green onions and parsley; correct seasoning with salt and pepper, set aside to cool. NATURAL ALTERNATIVES TO OVER THE COUNTER AND PRESCRIPTION DRUGS

PSORIASIS

Reprinted from a book by Michael T. Murray N.D.

A number of dietary factors appear to be responsible for psoriasis, including incomplete protein digestion. If protein digestion is incomplete, or if there is inadequate intestinal absorption of amino acids, bacteria can break down the amino acids into many toxic compounds. A number of gutderived toxins are implicated in the development of psoriasis. For example, a group of toxic amino acids known as polyamines (putrescine, spermidine, cadaverine) have been shown to be increased in individuals with psoriasis. These compounds contribute greatly to the formation of skin plaques. Lowered skin and urinary levels of polyamines are associated with clinical improvement in psoriasis. The best way to prevent the excessive formation of polyamines is to keep protein intake, especially from animal foods, at moderate levels while simultaneously increasing the intake of dietary fiber.

Insufficient intake of dietary fiber is associated with increased levels of gut-derived toxins. Dietary fiber is of critical importance in maintaining a healthy colon. Many fiber components are able to bind to bowel toxins and promote their excretion in the feces. It is therefore essential that the diet of an individual with psoriasis be rich in plant foods, especially whole grains, legumes, and vegetables.

Psoriatic patients have shown remarkable improvements while on a fasting and vegetarian treatment at a Swedish hospital where the effect of such diets on chronic inflammatory disease was being studied. The improvement was probably due not only to decreased levels of gutderived toxins and polyamines, but also to the changes in the intake of dietary oils.

Animal fats, particularly saturated fats and arachidonic acid, greatly increase the production of inflammatory compounds linked to stimulating the skin cells to divide too rapidly. It is best to eliminate consumption of meat (with the exception of fish) and other sources of saturated fats while





increasing the consumption of polyunsaturated oils, especially omega oils like flaxseed oil and fish oils. Several double-blind clinical studies have demonstrated that supplementing the diet with 10 to 12 grams of EPA oils results in significant improvement. This would be equivalent to the amount of EPA in about a five-ounce serving of mackerel, salmon, sardines, or herring.

Patients with psoriasis must not drink alcohol. Alcohol consumption is known to worsen psoriasis considerably. Alcohol's negative effects include the increased absorption of toxins from the gut, along with impaired liver function. The connection between the liver and psoriasis relates to one of the liver's basic tasks--filtering the blood. As mentioned above, psoriasis has been linked to several gut-derived toxins. If the liver is overwhelmed by an increased number of these toxins, or if there is a decrease in the liver's ability to filter them, the level of these compounds circulating in the blood will be increased, and the psoriasis will get much worse.

Natural Alternatives to Cortisone Creams

A number of botanical compounds have demonstrated an effect equal to or superior to cortisone when applied topically, but without side effects. Extracts of licorice and German chamomile are the most active. All natural creams/ointments containing one or both of these herbs offer an effective natural alternative to cortisone creams. Allantoin is another herbal substance that is often useful in treating mild skin disorders.

Licorice Extracts

Licorice (Glycyrrhiza glabra) contains a compound that, when applied to the skin, exerts an effect similar to that of cortisone in the treatment of eczema, contact and allergic dermatitis, and psoriasis. The compound, 18-beta-glycyrrhetinic acid, acts like cortisone, yet does not produce the negative side effects. In several studies, glycyrrhetinic acid has been shown to be superior to topical cortisone, especially in chronic cases. For example, in one study of patients with eczema, 9~ percent of the patients applying glycyrrhetinic acid demonstrated improvement, compared with 8~ percent using cortisone.

The anti-inflammatory action of glycyrrhetinic acid is largely due to its ability to inhibit the formation and secretion of inflammatory compounds, an extremely important feature when the skin is irritated and inflamed as in psoriasis and eczema.

Chamomile Extracts

Chamomile preparations are widely used in Europe for the treatment of a

variety of common skin complaints, including eczema, psoriasis, and dry, flaky, irritated skin. The flavonoid and essential-oil components of chamomile possess significant anti-inflammatory and antiallergy activity.

Allantoin

Allantoin is a compound isolated from comfrey root that has a long history of use in various skin-care products. Its effects on the skin are to soften, protect, and stimulate normal cell growth. Allantoin-containing preparations are useful in many skin complaints, especially those involving dry, scaly, or flaky skin such as eczema and psoriasis. Allantoin is extremely safe, nonallergenic, and nonirritating.

Final Comments

People with eczema and psoriasis usually need nutritional support. At the bare minimum, a zinc supplement providing a daily intake of ~O milligrams is indicated. For psoriasis, a special extract of milk thistle (Silybum marianum) known as "silymarin" has been reported to be of value." Presumably this is a result of its ability to improve liver function, inhibit inflammation, and reduce excessive cellular proliferation. The standard dosage of silymarin is 70 to 210 milligrams three times daily.

If you have psoriasis, get a tan. Sunlight (ultraviolet light) and/or tanning beds often provide benefit to individuals with psoriasis. Sunlight is preferred to tanning beds because most tanning beds feature ultraviolet A (UVA), while sunlight provides both ultraviolet A and B (UVB). UVB exposure alone has been shown to be effective, with minimal side effects.
