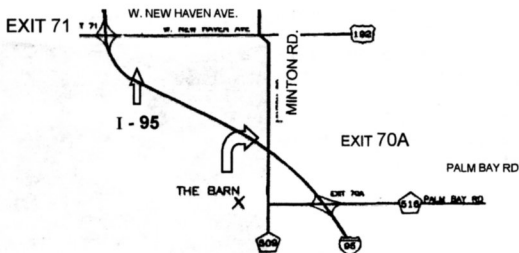

Neiman-Marcus Cookies

2 cups butter
4 cups flour
2 tbs. Soda
2 cups sugar
5 cups blended oatmeal
24 oz. Chocolate chips
2 cups brown sugar
1 tsp. Salt
1 8-oz. Hershey Bar (grated)
4 eggs
2 tsp. Baking powder
2 tsp. Vanilla
3 cups chopped nuts (your choice)



Measure oatmeal and blend in a blender to a fine powder.

Cream the butter and both sugars.

Add eggs and vanilla, mix together with flour, oatmeal, salt, baking powder and soda.

Add chocolate chips, Hershey Bar and nuts.

Roll into balls and place two inches apart on cookie sheet.

Bake for 10 minutes at 375 degrees.

WORD STUDY OF THE WORD

NEED

For even as the body is one, and hath many members, and all the members of that one body, being many, are one body, so also is the Christ, for also by one Spirit we all to one body were baptized, whether Jews or Greeks, whether servants or free men, and all into one Spirit were made to drink, for also the body is not one member, but many; if the foot may say, 'Because I am not a hand, I am not of the body;' it is not, because of this, not of the body; 'and if the ear may say, Because I am not an eye, I am not of body,' it is not, because of this, not of the body?

If the whole body were an eye where the hearing? if the whole hearing, where the smelling? and now, God did set the members of each one of them in the body, according as He willed, and if all were one member, where the body? and now, indeed, are many members, and one body the spirit members, and the eye is not able to say to the hand, I have no need of thee; nor again the head to the feet, 'I have no need of you.'

But much more the members of the body which seem to be more infirm are necessary,' and those that we think to be less honorable of the body, around these we put more abundant honor, and our unseemly things have seemliness more abundant, and our seemly things have no need; but God did temper the body together, to the lacking part having given more abundant honor, "I wish that there may be no division in the body, but that the members may have the same anxiety for one another, and whether one, member doth suffer, suffer with it do all the members, or one member is glorified, rejoice with it do all the members; and we are the body of Christ, and members in particular.

NEED – 5532 – employment, affair, occasion, demand, requirement, use, want, necessity.

It is the time of year for school and I am led to the word **NEED**. We **NEED** to have schools. We **NEED** to have classes where each person can learn. As you read the above verses from the Holy Bible, I Corinthians 12: 12 – 27, we could put any one of our organizations as the subject and each of the truths would be applicable to us. An organization does not exist because someone gets up before a group of people and makes announcements, or leads a business meeting. I am reminded of a very powerful truth and it is "there is no limit as to what you can accomplish as long as you do not care who gets the

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credit".

We all know organizations that are growing. We all know organizations that are dying. In each case it may not be the function that the organization is performing that leads to its achievements or to its failure, rather it is found in the members and the roll they perform in their organization. Often times the organization can thrive in spite of its "visible" leadership as there are real workers who don't care who gets the credit. They see a job that needs to be done and they do it. They are not worried as to whether they are the "head" or the "foot". These caring people are only concerned about getting the job done. They are the ones who make an organization thrive and grow. It is not necessarily the person that has the "leadership" role and the visible person. If the visible leader happens to be the real leader then the organization will not only exist, but will thrive and grow.

The body is not complete without all its members. It would be at a real disadvantage if it were a big eye, foot, hand or mouth. Who wants to be a "foot"? Who wants to be the "head"? If you have a sore foot you certainly realize how important that part of the body is. It is very hard to get around without a foot. How would you ever spread the word without a foot? Without a "hand" how would you greet anyone or give them a helping hand when they need help?

At times it is so easy to just blame someone for the problems we are experiencing rather than try to find the solution. In square dancing we see the problem as too few dancers. The solution is simple – get more dancers! The "how" to get more dancers appears to be a major problem to most clubs. We hear of really small or no classes. Then we hear of clubs that won't have a class if the numbers attending the classes are too small.

Remember, there were once just two dancers in the whole world! Remember, there were once only two people in the whole world. If you only have one square in your club, you have a great start toward building a great organization. It starts with each one of us. It is dependent on each one in the organization. Don't go looking for excuses or problems. Both are in plentiful supply and neither will help in any way. Don't do something expecting to get the "credit" for it. Instead, look for what needs to be done and DO IT! You will get your reward by seeing the organization grow.

Lay not up for yourself rewards in earth where thieves can enter and rob or rust destroy, but, rather lay up for yourself rewards in the heaven where neither thieves can rob or rust destroy.

Have a good recruiting season and work for the time is short.
