FROM THE LOFT

other type or hyphenated American. Does the hyphen mean that our allegiance is also hyphenated? Hyphens can only divide.



MARKET RESEARCH

(What It Can Do For Us) December 2000

How many times have you heard "We need to get more dancers?" There are many clubs that feel they need to increase the number of dancers at their club. They wonder where all the dancers are. It is good to know there are clubs that are growing by adding new members from classes. It is also sad to know there are clubs losing dancers that are not being replaced. A serious question is what can we do?

In the last two issues of The Barn Owl we provided a book review by Jim Mayo of an excellent book called "Bowling Alone". This book provides scientific research into the social involvement over the past few decades. The conclusion of this research is that social involvement in all group is that social involvement in all group

social activities has been declining due to various factors. This research shows clearly that the decline in the number of dancers over the past two decades has NOT been due to any internal issue but reflects the overall decline among ALL social activities.

The decline in the number of dancers has been blamed on many issues, among them are: the creation of the CALLERLAB program lists, the music, the clothes, the length of classes, too much to learn, and on and on. The good news is that we now know that the reasons for the decline are not internal.

We also know that since the overall attitude of non-dancers has changed so drastically we need to change the way we recruit new dancers. In the past people were eager to join all kinds of groups, including square dancing. We have, in the past, recruited new dancers by "word of mouth". Friends would bring friends and square dance clubs would grow. Some clubs would grow so much that they would have to turn people away. This is no longer the case, due primarily to the change in attitude of people toward social groups.

The next question is what should we do now? Clearly we need to change how we recruit new dancers. The old methods do not work like they used to. The answer to this question is not easy nor is it clear. We simply do not know enough about the current non-dancer to determine the best way to recruit them in the numbers we would like. There is good news, however. That good news comes in the form of the professional market research being done by the CALLERLAB Foundation For The Preservation and Promotion of Square Dancing.

This research is being conducted by a professional market research company known

as StarWorks based in Ann Arbor, MI. The research has included an Internet Survey of 1500 participants and Focus Group Surveys in three cities. The Focus Groups have been completed in Charlotte, NC; St. Louis, MO; and Portland, OR. In each city three groups participated in the survey. There were two groups of non-dancers and one group of people who have stopped dancing. Preliminary analysis of these surveys Indicates that non-dancers have a positive view of square dancing and would be willing to join the activity. The surveys also indicate we have problems concerning some of the "political" issues in the activity. Such "political" issues as debates about the style or color of the club dress, debates about what will be served at the annual club party night, or discussions about who will be the club officers are typical of the issues some of the ex-dancers expressed. Some new dancers are turned off by these debates and discussions to the point that they leave the activity simply because they do not want to be part of a group which cannot decide such issues in a civil manner.

This research is the result of a tremendous outpouring of financial support for the Foundation. This type professional market research is expensive and has only been possible through the very generous donations by dancers just like you. The foundation recently approved and began implementation of a long-range marketing plan known as "The Phoenix Plan (A New Beginning)".

This plan is a long-range plan to develop market strategies to increase the number of dancers in the activity. One of the major goals of the plan is to develop close ties among all organizations involved with the activity. Eventually sponsorships by major corporations will be sought. This type sponsorship will provide the financial support needed to implement a nation wide advertising campaign designed in accordance with the market research being conducted now.

This is an exciting time for square dancing. We are at a crossroads for the activity. We can help revive the activity to preserve it for the next generation. We can help preserve the very full heritage and tradition of this wonderful activity. There are few, if any, activities which offer the social interactivity, physical exercise and mental stimulation offered by square dancing. It is an activity that is enjoyed in a clean, safe, healthy, and enjoyable setting. The "social capital" (as defined in the book Bowling Alone) gained by attending a square dance class, joining a club or attending square dance festivals is difficult to duplicate in any other activity. Our challenge is to develop ways to spread the word about the tremendous benefits of this activity to the non-dancing public.

The Foundation needs your help, either in the form of a monetary donation or in the form of volunteer efforts. Please look for a way to help. Ask Jerry & Del how you can help.
