

SQUARE DANCING FOUNDATION INITIATES NEW MARKETING PLAN

The FOUNDATION (For the Preservation and Promotion of Square Dancing), recently kicked off the first phase of its exciting, new marketing and promotion effort. The Foundation, working in concert with all the diverse, organizations and components within the Square Dancing family, is developing a dynamic, long range and comprehensive marketing concept that identifies specific problem areas, and utilizes professional public relations and advertising assistance to create viable answers These are solutions that have practical application for all levels and elements within the square dance world. The plan will offer programs that address the concerns and needs, not only of the

existing 'family' of square dancers, clubs, associations, and callers, but also offers a new image of the activity aimed at the large majority of our population that has never 'squared up' on the dance floor.

Even before development of the plan began, the Foundation and its members began fund raising efforts for its support. The first step in this fund raising effort was taken last spring during the CALLERLAB convention in Dallas, TX. A group of eleven CALLERLAB members produced and recorded a promotional record titled "God Bless The USA." Donations in response to the "God Bless America" record have been tremendous. Additionally, numerous contributions from a diverse group of individual clubs, associations, convention organizations, and others, have helped validate the fund raising goal. Donations have topped \$50,000 surpassing the initial goal of \$30,000. This outpouring of generous support, even without a completed plan, truly reflects the committed nature of the average, dedicated square dancer. A strong round of "Thank Yous" goes out to everyone supporting this effort. This helps affirm, what has become a general recognition, that NOW is the time to share the 'best kept secrets' about this fun dance.





THE REST OF THE STORY

The newspaper had an entry. The story was that two young ladies were struck by a hit and run driver on north Wickham Road in Melbourne.

My husband and I were in Pensacola, Fl. at the time attending the funeral of my Daddy. Otis received the call from Dale McClary that our daughter was in the trauma center and was hurt real bad. Otis didn't tell me until we started back to Melbourne as he felt I had enough bad news as it was.

There is a lot more to the story than the paper gives, A drunk driver hits someone and drives off. In this case he later turned himself in with his lawyer. We do not know if charges were filed against him or not.

The first 24 hrs Kerri laid in the intensive care unit it was not known if she would live or not. She received lots of blood and underwent 9 hrs of surgery to "save her right leg", to patch severe cuts in her elbow, to examine her internal organs and repair her torn bladder. At this time they did nothing for her shattered shoulder and broken left leg. The scalp wounds left her hair a bloody tangled mess. But Kerri was alive.

Two operations later her shoulder was held together with plates, screws and pins. She could only move her right arm and hand. The right leg was held together with an external fixture with awful looking bolts extending through her leg to a device that was as black as it was cruel looking. This is the reality of the story that did not appear in the paper.

After 5 weeks in the hospital Kerri was moved to the Holmes Regional Extended Care and Rehab center a block away. Kerri was doing good. Her left shoulder was healing and she had some use of her left arm and hand. She felt real good about the progress of her left leg. The right leg had a lot of bone missing and she has to be 100% healed before the bone grafts can begin. Kerri was looking forward to having the cast off of the left leg and beginning therapy so she could use crutches.

On a Saturday night Kerri experienced a lot of pain in her left leg and had a fever of 103. By the time she got to see a Dr. on Tuesday morning she was in terrible pain and the cast was removed and her life was again shattered. She had STAPH infection and was put in the hospital and operated on Thursday night. All the plates, screws and rods holding the left leg together had to be removed to remove the source of the infection and the incision over 8 inches long, down to the bone, had to be left open so the wound could drain and be kept clean. She was placed on a regimen of 6 weeks of intravenous antibiotics.

Now her left leg was the "bad" leg. The bone they had hoped would grow back together in the left leg had died and had to be removed. Now she has two legs that must have bone grafts. It will be years before she is walking again.

The other girl that was hit at the same time left the hospital after a week and is doing good. Witnesses said that Kerri had pushed her out of harms ways when the car hit them.

Our lives are changed. We go daily to the hospital to help our daughter cope with her injuries and to help where we can. We have also learned, first hand, that there is a lot more to the story than a single entry in a newspaper.


