Room prices to be \$13.00 accommodations—— \$20.00 double room—— food could be included at \$7.00 a day per person. There will be a style show and luncheon Sunday afternoon, \$3.50 per person. Boots promised more information and Brochures for the next meeting.

Jim Taylor, liaison from the callers, stated that the morning calling for the 72 convention would be discontinued and that the afternoon calling would run from 1 -- 6, possibly to be cut at 4:30.

Morie Sogolow reported on the success of the Blood Bank in the West Coast and suggested other area consider the possibility of doing the same.

The next regular meeting is to be held in Clearwater on Labor Day weekend at the Knothead Konvention.

Len Levitt made a motion, 2nd by Walter Stoltz for adjournment. Meeting adjourned at 10:00 A.M.
