Pee Wee extended the Federation an invitation to hold their Oct. meeting in conjunction with this dance. Central is also working on Bicentennial plans.

# Gorrdinating Committe Report Jack Tucker

Jack reported that this was the 1st. meeting in a year. They had covered several things.

1. What has happened to the moneys for 1973, turned in to the executive account? This was to be brought back to the corrdinating committee at the Knothead Konvention.

- 2. Area Dances--Some doing well, others not. The callers are going to the callers committee and try to see if they can come up with, instead of having an out of state caller, have a caller from a distant association to call for free for the dance. His expenses would be paid and the hall.
- 3. Bow and Swing-- The possibility of going back to suscription dances.
- 4. Rules and Regulations of Conventions. Thrown-out. It was thought that the conventions have been going well and no need to, at this time, to force the convention committee in to a lot of red tape.

George Ephrem asked approximately, how many square dancers there were in Florida. Chairman Levitt said a figure of 15,000 was given a couple of years ago, which probably would be low now.

Chairman Levitt announced that the next Federation meeting would be at Knothead and the Association dues would be due.

### Sunshine Cloggers Debbie Bennett

An appeal was made to the Federation for money to go to the National Convention this year. It was decided the Federation couldn't finance a private enterprise. Private donations would be the best way.

Chairman Levitt told the delegates that there was an opportunity to buy a film that had been made of the last National convention. Having talked to some of the callers it was suggested we go half with them and buy this film jointly to be rented out to various square groups for promotion. Walter Stoltz, seconded by John Zellner, made a motion to take \$75.00 out of the Federation treasurery and buy this film, to be rented out in order to get our money returned. Motion passed. The callers will vote to decide if they want to make this a joint effort.

Mary Stewart ask the Federation to get permission from the state of Florida to use the Logo for the Bicentennial celebrations. Virginia McDonald gave the secretary the information to write for it. The secretary will write a letter asking to be recognized.
