

The regular meeting of Florida Federation of Square Dancers was called to order by Chairman Ron VanValkenberg at 10:00 A.M. May 29, 1977 at the Hilton Inn in Lakeland, Florida.

Virgil Green gave the invocation.

Roll call was taken by Secretary Joe Vaccari. A minute of silent meditation was held for Doris Vaccari and Joe Mieszalski.

Chairman VanValkenberg asked Jim Whiteman to be the Federation's liaison at the Caller's Meeting and Mori Sogolow at the Round Dance council meeting. Ray Carpenter represented the caller's association at our meeting. There was no representative from the Round Dance Council.

Chet Vetter moved that since all delegates had received copies of the minutes, that we dispense with the reading of the minutes. PeeWee Stewart requested that the minutes (Page 2-area reports (Central), last sentence) be corrected to read "...previously initiated, or initiated at the Friday evening dance." 


1977 CONVENTION REPORT - Walter Stoltz

Gratified with Convention and the wonderful support and co-operation from the Convention committee. Registrations are 3,132 as of today. Cannot give a financial report yet, but can say that we have paid all the bills and have about \$4,500 to put into the contingency fund of the co-ordinating committee. Final report will be given at the Knothead meeting in September.

The Chairman stated "a job well done, Walter" and concurrence was indicated by the delegates by a loud round of applause.

1978 CONVENTION REPORT - Central - John Layne

Each association is asked to take 500 registration forms back to their areas. Registration for the 1978 Convention will start today. Johnny Walter is the official Chairman for the callers. Chairman for the Florida cuers is K.O. and Phyllis Williams. Co-chairman for cuers is Joe & Madeline Augenglick. The registration forms offer a price break this year for early registration. A money advance was received from the 1977 Convention proceeds.

CO-ORDINATING COMMITTEE REPORT - Walter Stoltz

Members of the Co-ordinating committee:

Federation - Walter Stoltz, Len Levitt, John Layne, Marv Taylor, Frank Smith, Ron VanValkenburg, (ex-offico).

Callers Association - Pete Sansom, John Walter, Frank Bedell, John Sherley. Round Dance Council - Frank Dubois, Frank Gilbert.

The proposals presented by the co-ordinating committee for consideration were:

All State Conventions be held in a 50 mile belt running across Central part of Florida; Tampa, Lakeland, Orlando. Other locations in the Central part will be considered if facilities become available.

Each parent organization will appoint only one new replacement per year. This appointee will be a future co-chairman of a convention. One co-chairman from each organization will be appointed to run the State Convention. This method will provide the necessary continuity as each will serve 3 years; 2 before, 1 year after a state convention.

The Chairman of the co-ordinating committee will be the immediate past convention chairman. Term of office will be one year. Walter Stoltz is the chairman for next year.

The 1977 convention fund of \$4,500 will be deposited to a Florida S & R Dance Co-ordinating Committee bank account. \$2,000 will be taken out each year to sponsor the next convention. Any other disbursements will require the approval of the full co-ordinating committee. Checks will be co-signed by the past and present convention chairman. Each parent organization will be responsible for \$1,500 for tax purposes.



After a lengthy discussion, a motion was made by PeeWee Stewart and seconded, to accept the co-ordinating committee proposal except for that portion concerning location in the Central belt of Florida. An amendment to the motion was made and seconded to change the word co-chairman to vice chairman. The amendment motion carried 16 to 1. The primary motion carried 20 to 1.

OLD BUSINESS

Len Levitt made a motion which was seconded, that the West Coast Association receive money from the Federation Treasury, in the amount normally received under the old split system. After a lengthy discussion, the motion was tabled until the Knothead meeting.

NEW BUSINESS

Complimentary ribbons to the Georgia State Convention, September 16-17, 1977, in Macon were distributed to Federation Delegates. Any delegate that did not receive ribbons should contact the Federation Secretary.

George Garland urged the Federation and all square and round dancers to support the Georgia bid for the 1981 National Convention.

Evalyn Smith announced that in conjunction with National Square Dance week a special dance will be held Sept. 24, in the Governor's mansion. The Governor will lead the Grand march. Elmer Sheffield will call. All dancers were invited to attend.

John Zellner made a motion which was seconded to recognize past Chairmen of the Federation by a plaque or trophy. Motion carried.

Jim Whiteman and Mori Sogolow had nothing to report from the Caller's and Round Dance meeting. Ray Carpenter had no comments.

A standing round of applause was given to Walter and Esther Stoltz for their work in making the 1977 Convention a great success.

The next meeting of the Florida Federation of Square Dancer's will be held on September 4,1977 at the Knothead Konvention, Tampa, Florida.

The meeting was adjourned at 12:00 noon.
