



### HISTORY OF ROUND DANCING

Did you ever wonder how Round Dancing became associated with Square Dancing? Well, Ken Schacter did, and he asked me to write an article about it. My research indicates that Couples dancing has been happening at Square dances since before the advent of what we know as Modern Western Square Dancing. During the dance couples would do rhythms such as waltz, polka, two step, varsouvianna, mazurka and Viennese waltz either in a circle or amongst the squares. Of course, there were no cuers. The dancers did patterns that they had memorized. A Round Dance may be anything that is not a Square Dance. They can be done solo or in couples or in a group of dancers in a large circle. Modern Western Square Dancing emerged around 1950 with the advent of recorded music.

And equipment on which to play it. The number of Square Dance clubs exploded. Round Dancing also became more popular, and the dances became more complicated. There became clubs that specialized in just Round Dancing. The cuers were expected to be able to cue the dances from memory. Often the cuer would teach the dancers the first time through and then the dancers were expected to repeat it without cues. Now there are so many dances that cuers read the cues from a "cue card." Most of the callers were also round dance teachers.

Modern Round Dances are groups of cues that are 16 to 32 measures which are repeated several times during a dance. The Index of Rounds found on the Roundalab website have 30,000 dances listed. So, Squares and Rounds have been partners since the beginning of square dancing. So go out and learn round dances and increase your fun at the square dance.

# Florida Callers Association President's Report – Mark Fetzer, President

Somewhere near the bottom of the Grapevine is a flier for the 2024 State convention. The dates are Friday and Saturday, January 19th & 20<sup>th</sup>. Please let me encourage you to sign up now. Susan and I have and so have Bill and Mary Chesnut.

The Florida State Square and Round Dance Convention is 2 days of dancing, dance instruction and games. Last year there were 395 participants of all ages and abilities. There will be 6 different dance halls of different levels with 40 callers and cuers from around the state. During the day you will be able to take round dance lessons as well as square dance clinics as well as just dancing. Friday night there is a dinner show at the Deltona Center, so you do not need to leave the facilities.

Those who attended last year's convention, the location has changed again. I have toured the Center in Deltona (not Daytona) and it has a lot to offer. For those who did not attend last year, it was at the Volusia County Fairgrounds. The Deltona Center at Deltona is only five years old. The first upgrade you will notice is that it is easier to find your way into the parking lot. The parking lot is paved, has a covered drop-off area and parking is free.

As you go into the facility you will notice that they have thermostats that allow you to adjust the temperature. This year everything will be under one roof so you will not have to fear rain as you go from hall to hall. Everything is ADA compliant including electric door openers. Fast food restaurants are nearby with more upscale restaurants a little farther away.

The event flier lists the host hotel. For those who camp, dry camping will be allowed at the Center.

Spend the money to look good and well-groomed for the dance, but also spend some time on money on the things that make us better callers. It could be music, a caller's clinic or maybe a note service. Maybe even visit a club and research from another caller. None of us know it all, so keep adding to your skill. I enjoy looking at the definitions of the calls. Have you ever looked at a call to see if there is a different starting position or what would happen if you only used part of a call? It is a way to help the dancers better understand the call and to give us better ways to teach a call. I am always looking for one more way to teach or explain a call.

There is a proposal going around about changing the 2025 convention to Saturday and Sunday instead of Friday and Saturday. If you have an opinion email me or direct to Mark Fetzer, President of the FCA.




