LIGHTHOUSES OF FLORIDA St. Augustine Lighthouse (Haunted) Volusia Bar Lighthouse Ponce de Leon Inlet Lighthouse

<u>St. Augustine Lighthouse</u>: The current lighthouse is the second tower to be built on the north end of Anastasia Island between 1871 and 1874, but the first tower was officially lit in May of 1824 by the new territorial American Government and was the first of Florida's many lighthouses. However, it is recorded both the Spanish and/or the British governments had wooden "watch towers" as early as 1565.

The Spanish were in control of the area in 1737 and built a more permanent tower of coquina from a nearby quarry. Facing erosion and a changing coastline, the old tower crashed into the sea in 1880 but not before a new lighthouse was lit. Early lamps in the first tower burned lard oil for silver reflectors to shine the light out to sea. In 1885, after many experiments with different types of oils, the lamp was converted from lard oil to kerosene.

One of the early head-keepers was a Major William Harn, a Union war hero, and his wife (Kate) and their 6 daughters. They manned the lighthouse for 20 years. Two of their daughters are part of the "Haunting".

The "HAUNTING"

History relates a tragedy did happen at the lighthouse while Major Harn was its keeper. The lighthouse family was devastated by the death of two young daughters. One day, while playing in the surf not too far from shore, the girls were swept into the sea. Days went by before their bodies were recovered and buried on the lighthouse grounds. The younger of the two was 12 years old and had long brown hair. At one time the Coast Guard rented out part of the keepers' house. It was during one of these times a renter said he would hear someone humming like a little girl would hum when playing with her dolls. Other times he would hear giggles with a ball being bounced around but never saw anyone until one evening late he investigated a room where he had never been before. Creeping into the room he saw a young girl about 12 with long brown hair wearing a blue dress with a white pinafore. She had turned her head - but not her body - when she encountered him. He never searched for her again.

And there is a mystery surrounding Major Harn too. Every night the keeper had to carry a gallon bucket of kerosene in each hand, climb the steep stairs to the lantern room, trim the wicks and prepare the lamps. Then at daybreak do the same thing except to cover the lens prisms from the hot sun. This was grueling work and may have proved too taxing for the keeper or possible something else happened. The actual cause of his death is not known. He just keeled over and died. Did he break his neck, have a heart attack, or worse---murdered? They never found out. They buried him BUT is he resting in peace? Strange noises can be heard; footsteps following someone, heavy breathing, shadows, doors locked that should be open or vice versa. Many more interesting things have occurred while construction workers were renovating the lighthouse. Check the book *Haunted Lighthouses* by George C. Steitz. Very interesting.

<u>Volusia Bar Lighthouse</u>: This lighthouse was first constructed in the late 1800's on the southern area of Lake George. Since that area was so often hampered by prolong heavy fog it was first equipped with a "fog bell". This bell was adequate for a while but as trade travel increased it was decided in 1885 to construct an active lighthouse with lighting. This lighthouse became operational in 1886 and helped boaters until it's deactivation in 1916. The structure was left standing, but it was reverted to using "the bell" during foggy weather. The lighthouse was abandoned in 1943 and later destroyed by vandals with a fire in 1970.

<u>Ponce de Leon Inlet Lighthouse</u>: This Lighthouse has many interesting points associated with it: history, tragedy, mystery and it is the tallest lighthouse in Florida. The inlet giving the lighthouse its name honors Juan Ponce de Leon, the Spanish explorer. It was he who named the state *La Florida, "*the land of flowers", during his search for The Fountain of Youth.

The first lighthouse was built in 1834 but was never activated because of much Seminole strife at that time. The structure was damaged during bad storm in 1835 and completely toppled in 1836. A second lighthouse was not built until 1887.

Working the lighthouse was no easy task. Fuel for the lantern was hand carried up 213 steps to the lantern room, not an easy job in Florida's hot summers. Later that same year an actual glass lens was installed which worked great until 1893 when this lens was replaced by a more modern type of lens light. This worked well until 1970 when the lighthouse was shut down and became the prey to vandals. In 1972 the Ponce de Leon Inlet Preservation Association was formed and took over the restoration of the lighthouse and which now includes a museum, as it is today.

This concludes a brief synopsis of the many Lighthouses all around the State of Florida. If you would like additional information about any of them, I suggest you check out the website "Wikipedia" or look for "Florida's Fabulous Lighthouses" books that will be for sale at the convention. There are pictures of every lighthouse (all are interestingly beautiful) and lots more information that could not be included with each article.

We started with Cape Canaveral Lighthouse and traveled down along the east coast, around the Key West Area and up the west coast to the Pensacola area, then across the state to Amelia Island Lighthouse, ending with Ponce de Leon Lighthouse right here in Daytona Beach. It's amazing to learn there are 54 Lighthouses surrounding the State of Florida!
