

## From the Editor....



All the last minute details for the convention are being taken care of now as we head into the final stretch before Memorial Day weekend – May 25 - 27, 2012.

It has been brought to my attention that some dancers have the misconception that dressing for the theme of the convention, which is Mardi Gras Fun in the Sun, is only for "convention officials". This is incorrect. Anyone that wants to dress for the theme is certainly welcome to do so. Some people really enjoy dressing up in costume and others could really care less; do whatever you are comfortable doing.

On Saturday night everyone is asked to dress in their club colors. Those that will be participating in the Grand March are asked to take a seat in the Plus Hall to observe the ceremonies and they will be dismissed for line up in the Mainstream Hall before the Grand March begins. There is no point in leaving the Plus Hall early so you can be at the front of the line for the Grand March. There is a choreographed lineup that will be adhered to. We ask that when you do arrive in the Mainstream Hall, please keep the noise to a minimum so you can hear the line-up instructions. The Grand March will only include the chairman and cochairman of the convention, the Florida Federation officers, the Florida Callers Association officers, the Round Dance Council of Florida officers, the officers of each of the five regional associations, the officers of the Florida Singles and the Florida Campers, and four representatives from each club. Due to space constraints, we have to limit the number of participants in the Grand March. After the Grand March is finished, everyone that is sitting out is asked to join the others on the dance floor to dance the first tip called by the president of the Florida Callers Association, Roland Morin. Don't forget to bring you banners to carry in the March!

### **Traditional Square Dance**

Have you ever wondered what Traditional Square Dancing is? Maybe you have heard some of the old moves, like "Birdie in the Cage", "Texas Star", "Take a Little Peek", "Triple Duck" and many-many more. This will be a wonderful opportunity to try dancing like our parents and grandparents would have done.

Some of the best National Callers will be there. We have Jon Jones as the MC along with a little help from his friends, Deborah Carroll-Jones, Wade Driver, Marshall Flippo, Betsy Gotta, Tim Marriner, Mike Seastrom and Bob Worley. It's going be a great couple of hours. Find your way to the Contra Hall (Salon 4 in the Double Tree) on Thursday between 3 and 5pm.

Here's is a bit of history of how we got to where we are today and the story behind Traditional Square Dancing, written by Jon Jones.

#### TRADITIONAL SQUARE DANCING

Many of the things we do today in Modern Western Square Dancing came either from England or France. The settlers brought these dances with them while starting a new life in the New World. There are still several traditional groups in the New England area as well as some scattered across the U.S. They still dance the routines that were done more than 200 years ago and many of them dance to live music.

In the West, during the settler's migration across our country, square dancing had almost died. What kept it going in the New England area were the dance masters that came to the new land and it was called Country Dancing. The southern Appalachian area had good success in keeping it going and some of it moved toward the west but was not widespread.

In the early 1920's Mr. and Mrs. Henry Ford vacationed in Massachusetts where there was a dance master by the name of Benjamin Lovett. The Fords participated in the dancing and thought it would be a good activity for the management team of Ford Motor Company. Mr. Ford hired Mr. Lovett to come to Detroit to teach his employees to do the Country Dancing. He built a special hall for the activity that is still in operation today.

A young school superintendent in Colorado Springs, Colorado by the name of Lloyd Shaw was intrigued with a book by Mr. Ford and Mr. Lovett and began to research the activity in the mid 1920's. It was because of this book and the work by Dr. Lloyd Shaw that square dancing became known as the American Dance. "Pappy" Shaw, as he became affectionately known, published his first book in 1939 titled "Cowboy Dances" because he had researched the information from many cowboys in the Colorado area to get the routines that they learned to dance. Pappy taught many students and adults to square dance and had an exhibition group that traveled to Detroit in the early 1940's to dance with the Ford dancers. I personally knew one of the couples in that group and they have told me the experience was great.

All of the routines of traditional dancing had a name and they were always called the same way every time. The caller had to memorize the entire routine and it was a big NO-NO to call it anyway except the way it was written because the dancers had it memorized, too. Names like: Birdie In The Cage, Sally Goodin', Arkansas Traveler, The Route, Texas Star, Figure Eight, Cowboy Loop, Chase The Rabbit-Chase The Squirrel, Right Hand High-Left Hand Low, Take A Little Peek, Zig Zag Through, Denver Wagon Wheel, Triple Duck, Three Ladies Chain, and on and on.

This was the way square dancing was done until the mid 1950's when a few callers decided they could change some of the routines and mix them together to add more variety to the dance. These callers began mailing their ideas to each other and little by little the evolution to Modern Western Square Dancing began.

The session at the 61 NSDC will be the Traditional routines like those mentioned above. Each caller has chosen the routine they will do and each of them will be taught to the dancers so everyone can enjoy this type of dancing. Make plans to attend and you too will see how much fun we all had many years ago.

#### **New Callers Dance**

We are trying something new at the National this year. The Program Committee is sponsoring a New Callers Dance on Thursday, June 28 from 1-3 pm in the Contra Hall (Salon 4 of the Double Tree). So bring your record and/or memory stick and come on in. This is a great opportunity to let you, who are just starting out, have the chance to" try your stuff" at a National Convention.

So everyone, these new callers need your support. Please come in and dance a tip or two. Remember, all callers start at this point, even the National Callers had to start somewhere, right? Charlie Wofford (from Tacoma, WA) will be the MC. Any new caller is welcome to come on in and call. There will be a sign up sheet at the door.

#### **Registration & Housing Information**

**Housing** - Hotel rooms have become available at the Headquarters Hotel, Doubletree, and other nearby hotels because blocks of rooms were not fully used and dancers have cancelled who had these rooms reserved. The availability changes daily. Check the 61<sup>st</sup> NSDC website, www.61nsdc.com – click on Housing 2012 and you can make your own reservations.

**<u>Registration Hours</u>** - The hours that Registration Station will be open have changed slightly from the previously announced hours. New hours are: Tuesday, noon – 5 pm, and Wednesday thru Saturday, 9 am – 9 pm. Registration will be located in the INB Lobby at the west end of the complex. This should be your first stop at the  $61^{st}$  NSDC; to pick up your badge, bus pass, tickets, and other purchases.

**Purchases** - Advance purchase of additional items such as Program Books, Cook Books, Sewing Books, Syllabi, Bus Passes, and Dinner/Show Tickets will decrease your time in line at the Registration Station. The Daily Schedules listed in the Program Book will be reproduced in a pocket format, but are available only with the purchase of a Program Book. Quantities of the printed items will be limited to 10% more than the quantities pre-ordered. Dinner Tickets are limited to 1,500.

### The Party is About to Begin!

Are you ready for the time of your life? Get ready, get set, GO put on your dancing shoes and come to Spokane. The Program Committee has been working very hard and has a "mess" of stuff scheduled for you. There will be Mainstream, Plus, Advanced, Challenge, Youth Hall, Contra, Rounds, Clogging, Line Dancing and Exhibitions. We'll put the needle on the record (OK, push the start button on the ol' lap top) at 10 am each morning, and just keep it going until it's just past your bedtime. The Ghost Riders Square Dance Band will be "Pickin' Up a Storm" with all your favorite National Callers in the Mainstream Hall Thursday, Friday and Saturday from 7 pm until 10 pm. Then, of course, you will have several choices of After-Parties where you can continue to dance until 11 pm.

If you need a break from all the dancing, there is always shopping, shopping and more shopping in the Vendor Booth area. And, if you need to rest your tired feet for a bit, have a seat and watch some great Exhibitions from all over the United States.

Don't forget the **"Dance Party – Last Square Standing".** This should be a BLAST. There is the Open Party on Friday, where dancers from all ages can form a square and try to "out dance" the square next to you. Let's not forget the Youth Party on Saturday for those dancers under 18. Set up a square, and come and try your best to be the **"Last Square Standing"**. The medals, First, Second and Third Place, for both these events turned out great, and we are very proud of them. We have terrific National Callers for both events who will work very hard to break down the floor. So listen, and definitely do not anticipate. Watch out for those judges, they are keeping their eyes on you. **You need to sign up at least the day before each event.** You can do this at our table by the Registration Booth, or, better yet, go on to the 61<sup>st</sup> NSDC website – click on Dance Party – and register your square on-line.

Here is what is planned for you through the week. Don't forget to purchase your Program Book. It comes with Dailies; which are little booklets you can carry with you, for each day of the Convention. They will become your best friend. All dancing starts Thursday morning at 10am.

#### CLOGGING:

Sher Francis and her committee have a great three days of clogging planned. Workshops will be held during the day. There are clogging instructors from California, Canada, Oregon and last, but definitely not least, Washington, ready and excited to teach some great new routines. There will be an **Intro to Clogging** each day in the Clogging Hall at noon. If you have ever wanted to try clogging, here's your chance. Come on in and check it out. You never know, you may just get that "Clogging Fever". These Intros are a lot of fun for everyone, non-cloggers and cloggers alike. After a nice dinner break, it's time to put on your best duds and come party, clogging everything from the classics to today's new routines and beyond.

#### CONTRA:

Tom and Faye Tomlinson and their committee are working hard to put on a fabulous Contra program for everyone from the beginner to the learned Contra dancer. If you have never tried Contra before, you are in for a treat. They will also be having Intro workshops. It's not as tough as you might think and, you never know, it just may grow on you. Check out your Program Book for the schedule and location of the hall.

#### **EXHIBITIONS:**

Lonnie and Teresa Sewell and their Committee have a wonderful Exhibition program setup for you. There are seven groups from all over the country with routines of all different varieties. All day Thursday, and Friday afternoon you will find them all in the INB Performance Hall, so you can come in, sit down and enjoy all of the different groups. For your convenience, they will also be performing in all of the different halls on Saturday. Keep an eye out; they are worth watching more than once.

#### LINE DANCING:

Doug and Donna Riley, from Virginia, are returning once again, offering their expert services to teach Line Dancing. During the day come check it out, and learn all of the fun new line dances that you can do at your favorite "Honky Tonk", or even during a break at your local Square or Round Dance. These two are awesome teachers and have the greatest of attitudes. You can tell that they love what they do.

#### **ROUNDS:**

Randy and Marie Preskitt and their Committee have also been working hard to set up a fabulous Round Dance schedule for all levels of Round Dancers. In the morning each day, they will have the "Showcase of Rounds" to let you know what the instructors will be teaching throughout that particular day. From noon until 5 pm, those dances will be taught in-between the two halls set up for our Round Dancers. In the evening, both halls will be cued dances of

We have Hexagon (6 couple squares), High Energy (it speaks for itself; better have your running shoes on), and Handicapable (Come in and dance with these great people that are dancing in wheel chairs, or are other special need dancers. Dancing with these people will definitely put a smile on your face and in your heart, and you will help to give them the chance to dance – Don 't worry, these people CAN DANCE).

You can dance to callers from all over the world! Some of the callers may not speak English, but, all over the world, Square Dancing is called in English.

#### <u>BID SESSION, FRIDAY JUNE 29 9:00 – 10:30 A.M.</u> INB PERFORMING ARTS CENTER

At the Bid Session, excitement will be in the air, when two cities will be making presentations to host the National Convention in 2016. #### **The Boeing Company**

If you go west on I-90 out of Spokane to Seattle you will be in the city where William Boeing founded the Pacific Aero Products Company in 1917. It became the Boeing Airplane Company in 1918. The Company was first quartered in what is now known as "The Red Barn Museum", which is part of the History of Flight Museum. Boeing has become the largest aerospace company in the world and the largest employer in Washington State.

As if finding a ghost among the cumulus, The Boeing Company's latest addition to its lineage of pioneering commercial airplanes, the 787 Dreamliner, on May 8, 2011 caught up to its ancestor, a Boeing Model 40, in the skies over Mount Rainier south of Seattle.

The fully restored 1928 vintage Boeing Model 40, owned and flown by Addison Pemberton of Spokane, Wash., is the only flyable Model 40 in the world and the oldest flying Boeing aircraft of any kind. The Model 40 not only is notable as Boeing's first production commercial airplane, but its innovation and efficiency were the deciding factor in Boeing Air Transport (the airline subsidiary of the Boeing Airplane Company) winning the lucrative Oakland-to-Chicago air mail route in 1927. That event set William Boeing on a course that, within just two years, would take him from managing his airplane company in Seattle to presiding over a vast nationwide aviation empire called United Aircraft and Transport Corporation (UATC).

The 787 and Model 40, both the technological leaders of their time, represent 80 years of Commercial Airplanes leadership and clearly illustrate the dramatic progress in airplane design.

During those 80 years, the people of Boeing have introduced innovative technologies that have revolutionized flight and defined the design of all commercial airplanes.
