

What Image Are We Projecting?

There are a lot of articles, videos, interviews, and discussions out there about what’s wrong with square dancing today and what we can do about it. I think we agree on all the following, BUT...

1. People don’t like the full frilly skirts with crinoline’s, the long pants and long sleeved shirts and many clubs have gone to casual **BUT** why do we continue to use clip art and photography that shows only full frilly skirts with crinoline’s, the long pants and long sleeved shirts? Why do we still have clubs that only have casual attire during certain months? Just because a club says they are casual, doesn’t mean you cannot wear full square dance attire.

2. Some people don't like country music **BUT** when we do demos we don't use a variety of music i.e. rock and roll, jazz, movie themes, etc.
3. We tell people that anyone can square dance **BUT** when we do demos we all show up in matching full frilly skirts with crinoline's, the long pants and long sleeved shirts like we're professional dancers. This scares people off.
4. We have a reputation of being hokey and not being up with the times **BUT** we continue to use old clipart that looks like it's from the '40's and like we are a bunch of hillbillies. Below are samples of the clipart I am referring to.



We need new clipart and photography!!

5. We need young people and families **BUT** we continue to use photos and videos of white-haired dancers who can barely walk, in many cases, instead of young people and multi-generational squares laughing and cutting up. Our demo squares should have young people in them so spectators can see that all ages can participate.
6. People don't want to have to go to a class to learn to square dance **BUT** we continue to create flyers that state "learn to square dance", "classes start", "learn in 12 weeks". We should stress that they are new dancers and will be dancing the very first night.
7. People don't like long commitments (or contracts) **BUT** we don't say anything about there are "no contracts", "pay-as-you-go", and "no commitments".
8. People say they can't dance; they have two left feet **BUT** we continue to say it is dancing when in fact it's walking to music.
9. People today are very health conscious **BUT** we don't mention the health benefits of walking, relieving stress, lowering blood pressure, etc. Many of us have been told we need to do more walking and lose weight. What better way than to square dance on an even surface, air conditioned, and with other people?
10. We need younger dancers **BUT** the flyers are only put out at square dances instead of out in public where everyone can see them. Why not put them up at the YMCA, schools, recreation centers, etc.?

Why Not Continue Learning?

Every year we struggle to get experienced dancers to help with our new beginner dancers. They think they have learned everything there is to learn for the level of dancing they want to do. They have forgotten what it was like when they first started dancing.

No matter what you are involved in, attending seminars, workshops, classes, etc. improves your skill. The same holds true for square and round dancing, and also holds true for callers and cuers. There is always something new to learn. Not only that; definitions are revised and calls are moved from one list to another and sometimes back to the original list.

I have helped with several new dancer groups and found out the following:

1. **Courtesy Turn** – *Men, the extended left hand [palm up] as a direction indicator and the man uses his left hand to lead, not pull. Place the right hand in the small of the lady's back. Ladies use the right hand to work the skirt¹.* The men should extend their left hand palm up so the woman can lay her left hand on top of his. Taking the woman's left hand a handshake hold can be painful for someone who suffers from arthritis in the hand or wrist. This will also stop the man from pulling the woman around. Note that the "ladies use the right hand to work the skirts" not put it behind the back for the man to take. With the woman's right hand behind her back, if someone stumbles while holding on to that right hand, a shoulder can be dislocated (and it has happened).
2. **Teacup Chain** – all of the turns are arm holds until the very last one which is a courtesy turn back in to the center of the square. Men you are only to touch which ever arm the woman extends to you – no courtesy turn until the very end.
3. **Recycle** – *Starting formation – ocean wave only. The ends of the wave cross fold as the centers of the wave fold in behind the ends and follow them around, and then face in to end as two facing couples².* There is nothing in this definition about hold hands at any time. This also applies to linear cycle – no hand holds!
4. **Promenade** – *In promenade position the man's hands are palm up, right forearm over the lady's left arm. Lady's hands are palm down in man's hand³.* Again, holding the woman's left hand in a hand shake position is difficult for someone suffering from arthritis in the hand or wrist.

5. **Couple handhold in circles:** In circles with alternating men and women, men's palms are up and women's palms are down. In circles where same genders are adjacent, everyone has the right-hand palm up and the left-hand palm down⁴.

You might be surprised by what you would learn if you attended new dancer dances! But of course, don't forget there is only one instructor and that's the caller!

World's Oldest Square Dance Caller Keeps Central Valley Dancing

At 89, Ernie Kinney is the oldest active square dance caller in the world. That's according to [CALLERLAB, the International Association of Square Dance Callers](#).

The former Marine and schoolteacher has called all over the world and in all 50 states. These days, he's still in demand — just sticking a little closer to his longtime Fresno home. He calls every Monday night in Hanford, about 45 minutes away. And every Thursday, dancers dressed in Western wear can find him calling for the Travelin' Pioneers Square Dance Club at the Clovis Senior Center outside Fresno.

"I'm the only caller who still uses 45 rpm records. That's all I have. I don't want to do that other stuff. I'm not gonna be here that much longer anyway," he says. "I'm gonna retire probably in 15 years."

Mirdza Ward does round dance cueing and has spent plenty of time around Kinney.

"You go to other states and you talk to your square dance friends and they cannot get over that we can dance to Ernie Kinney every week!" she says. "They're very jealous of that."

She says Kinney's "humor is funny as all get-out. Of course we've heard it a number of times but it gets funnier every time he tells it to us."

It's not long before Kinney comes up to Ward with a joke. "I've told 'em three times," he says. "Ten times. Never go to bed right after you take a laxative and a sleeping pill."

Kinney was born in Oklahoma but has lived in the Central Valley for most of his adult life. He taught in the tiny town of Cantua Creek on the west side of the valley for 24 years, the last 10 as superintendent.

"We would start in September back in those days with 350 kids. By mid-October, when the cotton was being picked, we'd have 500," he says.

Kinney says he started calling square dances when he lived in Cantua Creek. He's been invited just about everywhere as a caller, including Hong Kong, Tokyo, Australia, New Zealand, England and Sweden.

"I'll call until the day I die," he says. "Maybe not the day I die but until the day I die."
